Music majors will be required to audition in person with the Department of Music. Seven-Year Medical Program^Δ:

Students must have a minimum SAT score of 1400 (*ACT scores are not allowed to be used as a substitute*) on the Critical Reading and Math sections from ONE test date and rank in the top 10% of their high school class to be considered for Seven-year Medical Programs. These applications must be submitted no later than January 1st.

Seven-Year Optometry Program^Δ:

Students must have a minimum SAT score of 1300 on the Critical Reading and Math sections and rank in the top 10% of their high school class to be considered for Seven-year Optometry Programs. All applications for the Seven-Year Optometry Program must be submitted by January 1st.

Educational Opportunity Fund Program (EOF):

The EOF Program is available to New Jersey residents who have a high school diploma or an equivalent degree. Qualified students must attend the required summer program and must enroll full-time at TCNJ. EOF students must come from families and/or communities disadvantaged by low income, high unemployment, a dependence upon welfare, substandard housing, or the lack of access to the quality educational preparation necessary for college. EOF students also must be academically motivated and meet the financial guidelines set by the New Jersey Commission on Higher Education listed below:

- **TOEFL** (Test of English as a Foreign Language) Scores: TOEFL is required if English is not your native language. A score of 550 is recommended, 90 on the computer-based exam.
- **Completed Affidavit of Support Forms:** These forms can be obtained on the International Applicant website.
- **Financial Information Form:** Also included in the International Student Applicant website, this form verifies full funding for your education. *Note that financial aid and scholarships are not available to international students.*
- **Transcripts:** Applicants are required to submit ALL Transcripts. Transcripts must be submitted to a United States agency that provides foreign credentials evaluations before being sent to TCNJ.
- **Doctor's Certification:** This certification is used to determine if you are in good health and have had your vaccinations.
- **A WASC Transcript** if you are an applicant from West Africa.
