Does your city or county have a forensic laboratory and do they take interns? From there, you can move to state and federal agencies. Are there private forensic laboratories in your area? Do you have to stay locally, or are you willing to move? If so, many more opportunities open up. So get out there and see what's available! Below is some information that might get you started in searching for a summer internship:

*** New York Division of State Police Laboratory Internship Program**

The Laboratory's Intern Program was established in 1998 to provide students and graduates with opportunities to learn more about the forensic science field. This is an unpaid internship designed for students interested in Forensic Science who may be considering a career in that field. This program allows students to gather specific knowledge, above that gained in the shadow program. Assignments can vary depending on the student's interests and academic coursework.

CSTSP internships offer graduate students a unique opportunity to gain valuable real-world experience in this very exciting and competitive field.
