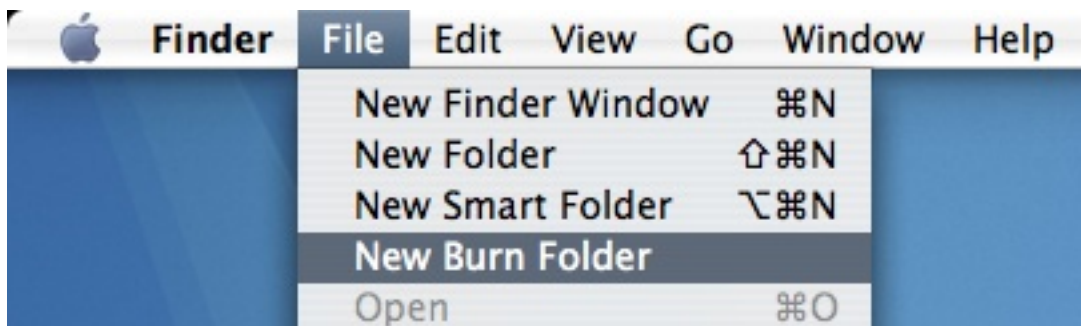


Burning a CD in Mac OS X 10.4

These instructions are for the built-in mechanisms for CD burning under Mac OS X 10.4.x. Although there are a few methods for burning a CD under Mac OS X 10.4, the following method is possibly the easiest and allows the user to create multiple copies of the same data if necessary.

1. Make sure the **Finder** is the foremost application.
2. Select **File -> New Burn Folder**



3. A Folder with the Burn symbol will be created on your Desktop. Please rename this folder. Its name will become the name of your final burned CD.



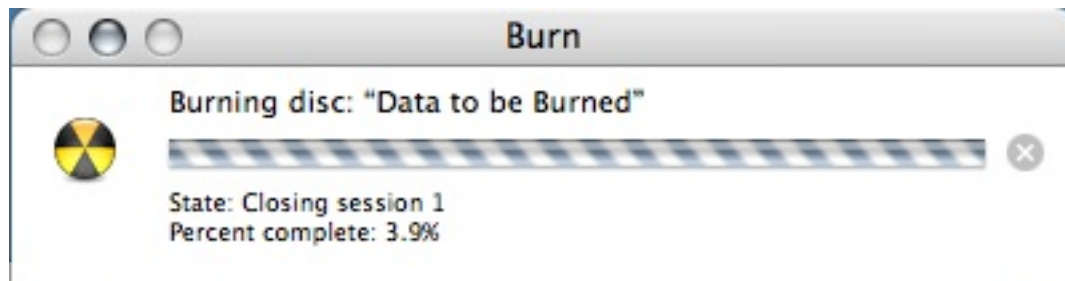
4. Open the folder and copy any files you wish to burn into this folder. *Note that you are not actually moving the files into this folder, only making shortcuts to the files to be burned.*
5. Once you have copied all the files you wish to burn, press the **Burn** button near the upper right of the window.



6. You will then see the following window. If you did not rename your Burn Folder during step 3, you may name your CD by changing the Disc Name. You may also change the Burn Speed. The default is the maximum speed of your burner.



7. Click **Burn** to create your CD.
8. While your disc is burning, you will see the following window showing the progress of your CD.



9. When the disc is done, it will mount onto your desktop. From here you may choose to view the files on the CD or eject the CD.
10. If you wish to make more copies of your CD, return to step 5 and repeat. You may also keep the burn folder on your desktop if you plan to burn the CD again in the future.
